Homework

Homework is an extension of in class material and may be assigned with each chapter. It will usually consist of reading. Completion is a must in order to achieve success in this course. Some homework will require written work.

Late Work

When a student is absent they are responsible for making up any work that was missed. For excused absences. Missed tests, essays and quizzes must be made up within three calendar days after you return to school. Reasonable accommodations will be made for special circumstances. Late work is to be completed by the date of the summative assignment for each unit/chapter. Late work will not be penalized more than 50%.

Explanation of Zeroes

Assignments will be given a value of zero if not submitted before the assessment for that chapter.

Reassessment

Students who have received a failing grade on a test may be reassessed, within one week of receiving the grade, if the student participated in class, completed all class assignments for the unit, demonstrated evidence of their best efforts on the assessment and completed all remediation assignments. Student will be responsible for scheduling a time for reassessment.

Make-up Work

When a student is absent they are responsible for making up any work that was missed. This includes communicating with the teacher or other students about these missed assignments. For excused absences, missed tests, essays and quizzes must be made up within three calendar days after you return to school. Reasonable accommodations will be made for special circumstances. Late work will not be penalized more than 50% if completed by the date of the summative assignment for each chapter.

Extra Credit

Extra credit assignments will not be given. Although, extra credit points may be awarded to those students who take initiative on certain assignments. Details will be discussed the first day of class.
